



LOW COST TREE PROGRAMS IN TUCSON

1. Tucson Clean and Beautiful (TCB) - \$20 Trees, delivered

Order and pay on line. After order receipt, trees are delivered within several weeks (no longer than 4 weeks).

TCB has excellent edible, native, near-native and non-native trees to choose from, all appropriate for this desert region. If you don't see a tree you are looking for, email tft@treesfortucson.org for an availability check.


All trees are 5 gallon sized and grown in the Tucson area by professional growers. Tree descriptions are below. Tree availability changes. Non-native edible trees are \$25. All other trees, including native edibles, are \$20 delivered.

To place your tree order, click on the green button that says "Order Trees Online" to select trees and pay by card. If you want a paper application, print out [printable order form](#) and return with a check.

Blue Palo Verde	Cat Claw Acacia
Desert Willow	Jujube
Foothills Palo Verde	Net Leaf Hackberry
Mexican Elderberry	Red Push Pistache
Palo Brea	Southern Live Oak
Screw Bean Mesquite	Velvet Mesquite
Texas Ebony	Vitex (aka Chaste Tree)
Whitethorn Acacia	Chinese Elm (May be invasive.)

2. Tucson Electric Power (TEP) Trees for You Program – Trees for \$5, Pick up at Nursery (can choose Harlow)

Set up an Account based on your TEP Account and order, pay on line, and receive email notification from nursery pickup of your choice.

TEP customers may order up to two 5-gallon shade trees for a discounted price of \$5 each by logging into **My Account**. Please be certain of your selections, as orders cannot be changed and there are no exchanges.

Choose from 14 varieties of seasonal, year-round and deciduous trees that drop their leaves in the fall and winter:

Arizona Ash	Hackberry Tree
Arizona Cypress	Honey Mesquite
Chinese Elm	Native Mesquite
Chinese Pistache	Palo Brea
Chitalpa	Southern Live Oak
Desert Willow	Sweet Acacia
Foothills Palo Verde	Texas Ebony

NOTE: Number of trees is per year. Kate Avery ordered two trees in September, Harlow's pickup and trees are gorgeous.

3. Desert Survivors (DS) Nursery - 1020 W. Starr Pass Blvd.

Desert Survivors, Inc. is a unique organization that combines a highly diverse native plant nursery with an employment program for adults with developmental disabilities. Visit the retail plant nursery, buy some high quality, locally grown native plants, and support a great community based organization. Desert Survivors has been in business for 35 years and is a 501(c)(3)-non-profit corporation.

NOTE: Because DS is nonprofit, there is no tax charged. They have plants, shrubs and trees and more.
